Who are we?

The Children's Society Advocacy Service is an independent and confidential service for children and young people.

Who is the service for?

It helps children and young people in Cheshire West and Chester who are involved with Children's Services. You could be:

- A child or young person cared for by Cheshire West and Chester.
- A care leaver.
- Disabled.
- On a Child Protection or Child In Need plan.
- A child or young person seeking asylum.
- Wanting to make a complaint against social services.

What is an advocate?

An advocate is a person that will support you to have a voice and speak out about the issues that are important to you.

- Advocates are independent and confidential – they don't work for the council or children's services.
- They will not tell anyone what you say to them without your agreement, unless there is something that may cause harm to you or to someone else.
- They can speak on your behalf and help you share your voice.
- They will give you advice and information and write letters on your behalf, as well as speak for you in meetings.




What can an advocate do for you?

- Listen to you and help you understand your rights.
- Support you to speak out about any problems or worries and to ask for help about issues you are finding difficult.
- Help make sure you are treated fairly.
- Help you say what you think about things.
- Help you make sure others are listening to what you have to say.
- Respect and value you as an individual.

What are your rights?

- To have a say in decisions that affect your life.
- To be listened to and taken seriously.
- Access to an advocate to help you look after your rights.
- Be treated fairly whatever your race, religion, sexuality, gender, language or disability.
- Get the most out of your school or college.
