

Safety Advice

Please read the Safety Advice document and the enclosed emergency instruction document carefully and keep them in a safe place where you can easily access them. Ensure that everyone residing at, visiting, or present for work on this property is aware of and understands these instructions.

If a major accident occurs at Backford North PSD, you will be alerted by the site's COMAH siren/alarm. An "all clear" signal will be given by a subsequent siren once any danger has passed.

Test

The sirens are tested on the third day of each month at 3pm. The test is a 15 second alert warning, 10 second silence and 5 second all clear signal. You do not need to take any action during test alarm signals.

EMERGENCY INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR SAFETY

Backford North Petroleum Storage Depot (PSD)

GO IN, TUNE IN, STAY IN

GO IN

- On hearing the siren, everyone must go inside immediately.
- If children are at school – do not attempt to collect them – they will be looked after until it is safe to go outside.
- Shut all outside doors and windows.
- Turn off any ventilation, heating or air conditioning system that draws in air from the outside.
- Pull curtains/blinds across windows facing the Backford North PSD site.

STAY IN

- Stay in a room that does not face the Backford North PSD site.
- Remain indoors until you receive instructions.
- Do not use mobiles and landline phones unless you urgently need help. This will keep the phone lines free for emergency responders.
- Please do not try to leave the area unless told to evacuate.
- Please co-operate with the emergency services and follow their instructions.
- An 'all clear' will be given when it is safe to go outside.

TUNE IN

Tune in to the local radio and TV stations which will broadcast further information.
