Footpath numbered Footpath 20 in Farndon commencing at Churton Road (C821) at OS grid reference SJ 4132 5487 then running in a generally easterly direction for approximately 129.6 metres to the junction with Harrier Way (UX1971) at OS grid reference SJ 4145 5488 (as shown between points A and B on the order plan MO/571B) with a variable width of 3 m to 4.9 metres (as shown shaded between boundaries on the order plan).

Footpath numbered Footpath 21 in Farndon commencing at Harrier Way (UX1971) at OS grid reference SJ 4146 5488 then running in a generally easterly direction for approximately 137.9 metres to the junction with Public Footpath 8 Farndon at OS grid reference SJ 4159 5490 (as shown between points C and D on the order plan MO/571B) with a variable width of 3 m to 4.9 metres (as shown shaded between boundaries on the order plan)
