



Essential components - what do they all mean?

Equity, Diversity and Inclusion 	<p>Equity means refers to fairness and justice - recognising that we do not all start from the same place and must acknowledge and make adjustments to imbalances.</p> <p>Diversity is about recognising and valuing individual differences.</p> <p>Inclusion means including or being included within a group or structure, and also the practice or policy of providing equal access to opportunities or resources to those who may otherwise be excluded or marginalised.</p>
Safeguarding 	<p>Safeguarding means protecting people's health, wellbeing and human rights, and enabling them to live free from harm, abuse and neglect.</p> <p>Safeguarding includes the Prevent Duty and Online Safety.</p>
Prevent Duty 	<p>The aim of the Prevent strategy is to reduce the threat to the UK from terrorism by stopping people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorism.</p> <p>Prevent duty includes British Values and issues relating to extremism and radicalisation.</p> <p>British Values are a set of four fundamental values that are promoted in schools and more generally as part of living in Britain today. These four values are: Democracy, The Rule of Law, Individual freedom and mutual respect, and Tolerance of others of different faiths and beliefs.</p> <p>Extremism is defined in law as 'vocal or active opposition to fundamental British values'.</p> <p>Radicalisation is the process by which a person comes to support terrorism and forms of extremism leading to terrorism.</p> <p>If you have any concerns about anything relating to the Prevent Duty, speak to the tutor or report your concerns to the Police confidentiality line on 0800 789 321.</p>
Online Safety 	<p>The key issues surrounding adults and online safety include:</p> <p>Identity Theft: Online Criminals will try to trick you into giving them your information, a process known as phishing.</p> <p>Computer Security: Online criminals will try to attack your computer either to steal from you or attack other people.</p> <p>Cyber bullying is when one person or a group of people try to threaten, tease or embarrass someone else by using a mobile phone or the internet.</p> <p>Social Networking: If you are using Social Networking sites, use the site's privacy features to restrict strangers' access to your profile.</p> <p>For more information visit: https://www.ceop.police.uk/safety-centre/</p>
