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Holford Gas Storage Ltd (HGSL), run by Uniper Energy Storage Ltd, is a natural gas storage facility located in mid-cheshire, close to Byley village.

HGSL is committed to operating to the highest safety standards and we have a wide range of systems and procedures in place to protect the health and safety of our employees and the general public.

Under the Control of Major Accident Hazards (COMAH) regulations 2015, natural gas is classed as a hazardous substance.

While an accident on site, such as a leak, is highly unlikely, it is our responsibility to inform you of the action you would need to take in the event of an emergency.

This information has been prepared in accordance with the COMAH regulations and in consultation with Cheshire Shared Services Emergency Planning and the Emergency Services.



Please read this card carefully and follow the instructions if you become aware of a serious incident on the site.

Keep this card in an accessible place in your home or display prominently in business or community premises.

Emergency Instruction Card

For use in the event of an emergency



1. Do not leave the area

You may travel into danger or hinder access required by the emergency services



2. Advise elderly or disabled neighbours

Assist any elderly, deaf, blind or disabled neighbours



3. If you are outside, go into a home or building



4. Close doors and windows

Switch off ventilation and air conditioning systems



5. Avoid using the telephone

Keep lines free for the Emergency Services



6. Co-operate fully with the instructions given by the Emergency Services



7. Tune into the local radio

Information and advice will be broadcast on a number of frequencies (see opposite)



8. Remain indoors until the emergency is over

The Police will give the 'All Clear'
