Welcome to the third edition of our Newsletter.

We've had a busy few months and are delighted that our services continue to go from strength to strength. We're thrilled that our Northwich Supported Living Network, Learning Disability Respite Service at Dorin Court and Shared Lives service were all recently inspected by the CQC and all three were given a Good rating. Our Learning Disability Respite Service at Dover Drive has been through re-accreditation by the National Autistic Society.

We are continuing to make good progress with a wide range of new and exciting partnership developments including:

- Bread-Making Co-operative A
 Co-operative making and selling
 artisan bread to the local
 community in Chester is in
 development. This will be run by
 the Wesley Church and will
 operate out of the newly
 refurbished kitchen in Canal
 Street when this is completed
 later in the year.
- Drama Group To be run by Action Transport Theatre with performances to be given at Storyhouse and the Civic Hall.
- Volunteering Opportunities We're working with Chester
 Volunteer Action (CVA) to
 promote a wide range of new
 volunteering opportunities
 across all of our services, which
 will be widely advertised.
- Friendships and relationships As a sub-group of the Learning
 Disabilities Partnership Board,

- we are working with service users and other partners to develop a more ambitious programme of social events to increase the opportunities for building friendships and relationships across our Learning Disability community.
- Green Team / Alexander Park,
 Hoole As part of the new Green
 Team service and working with
 the Council's Greenspace Service,
 we are supporting a major
 funding bid to regenerate
 Alexander Park in Hoole as a
 Pollinator Park with community
 and volunteer facilities which
 Vivo service users will actively
 engage with.
- Holiday Activities Working with local partners, we are looking at opportunities to deliver more holiday options to our service users.
- Apprenticeships and work
 placements Working with our
 local colleges we are establishing
 an annual Apprenticeship
 programme and also offering

- work placements including supported employment placements with the Bren Project, the first placement of which commenced in Lightfoot Lodge in October 2018.
- Assistive Technology Working with Well-being, we are receiving free assessments of assistive technology opportunities in our main service areas in order to explore potential improvements in service provision as part of the wider Wellbeing contract with the Council.
- **Brio** Close partnership with Brio is leading to accessing many new services including new Rebound service and Disability swimming classes (Ellesmere Port), extended services at Neston (the Rec), discounted access to the culture offer (such as Pantomime in Winsford) and free staff car access at Northwich Memorial when new public car park charges were introduced in November 2019.



Reducing **Loneliness** in Our Villages for 25 Years

Our volunteer day centre in Saughall has been serving the elderly in our community for 25 years, providing a meeting place for the over 65s who are unable to access other community facilities independently. The service invites members to attend the 'Friday club' enabling them to feel part of their community and enjoy each other's company.

Volunteer, **Maureen Maxwell**, has supported the members in Saughall village from the beginning, dedicating 25 years of her time and putting her heart and soul into supporting the team at the day centre, whether that be chair exercises, memory games or making a cup of tea. Maureen adds "It's so rewarding. I enjoy seeing residents coming to the club and meeting everyone and it's lovely to see the members enjoy themselves."

The centre celebrated its 25th anniversary on Friday 25th January 2019 with all the Friday club members and volunteers, along with a special visit from the Lord Mayor and the Lady Mayoress of Chester. The event included a celebratory lunch and cake, followed by a performance from the local primary school.





Lord Mayor of Chester, **Councillor Alex Black** was delighted to attend the event, adding "This service is a credit to the village. To be open as a volunteer centre for residents within the area, offering valuable support to those feeling lonely and isolated for 25 years, is incredible. The service has continued from strength to strength and continues to be valued by our residents. I would like to thank all the volunteers, who have dedicated their time to work with vulnerable adults in our community and have continued to do an amazing job. I love attending these events and chatting to everyone."

Manager of the service at Saughall day centre, **Gaynor Harris** adds "We're a great family. We make members very welcome with activities and a home cooked lunch. The volunteers enjoy spending time with members and the members love coming and spending time with everyone."

One of the members of the Friday club, **Vera Joyce** said "I love the company and getting out of the house. I used to be a volunteer so I was involved in the steering group and helping out, driving members to the venue and back home."

As well as the volunteer day service in Saughall, we also run volunteer day services in Willaston, Waverton and Farndon. The service enables elderly residents who feel lonely and isolated to attend the centres, helping to improve their overall wellbeing. Activities include games, bingo, quizzes and various arranged performances. Members also enjoy a homemade cooked lunch.

Lightfoot LodgeBuilding Works Consultation

On Thursday 17th January we hosted a consultation event with parents, carers and staff to discuss with the architect and contractor the redesign of Lightfoot Lodge – what services and activities they want to take place there, the layout and use of the rooms, layout of the garden and the overall look and feel of the building. It was really well attended and lots of ideas and indeed excitement in the room about the planned improvements. The current plans are on display in the Board Room at Lightfoot Lodge for the next month for anyone to look at. A follow-up event will take place in March 2019 and building works will commence shortly afterwards.



Through working in partnership with National Autistic Society we have recognised the need to provide Specialist Autism Training to our Support Staff and Managers. To do this we commissioned Autism Together to train a large proportion of our staff in Basic Autism Awareness as part of the Autism Together champion scheme.

The Course Aims were:

To raise awareness and challenge the neuro-typical perception of autism

To increase knowledge and confidence when supporting individuals on the autistic spectrum

To consider robust autism specific strategies and approaches in support of the person with autism

To encourage inclusion, understanding and acceptance of those on the autistic spectrum within the wider community

Luke Sheehan, the Manager of our Autism Service in Ellesmere Port, says 'Having our staff receive this training has only further enhanced the quality of service we are able to deliver to those Individuals who have an Autism diagnosis'.

Service User Awards

Are you interested in being a **Shared Lives Carer?**

Our Shared Lives service supports vulnerable adults over the age of 18 who have a physical, learning or mental health disability, as well as older people. Shared Lives Carers support people to live as normal and socially inclusive lives as possible and can either provide:

- Sessional support supporting someone for a few hours a week in a variety of settings.
- Short term support helping someone take a break by providing overnight care from one night to a few weeks.
- Intermediate care welcoming someone to live in their home as part of their family.

Becoming a Shared Lives carer can be an incredibly rewarding and satisfying role, sharing your life and activities with another individual and helping them to live a much more enjoyable, varied and sociable life. We have had many inspirational stories of the transformation this has brought to the life of both the carer and the individual being cared for.

Whenever you're in Chester, why not pop into our café at the end of the Little Roodee car park near Chester Racecourse.

The café sells a delicious range of food and beverages, has free wi-fi and ample parking. We also provide a catering service to businesses and can cater for your events.



The café provides vocational training and employment opportunities to adults aged 18 and over with a learning disability in food preparation, customer service, good hygiene practice and team working. Service users have the option to undertake accredited as well as non-accredited training, after which they will be supported into employment in the catering industry if they wish.

We welcome self-referrals from self-funders and those in receipt of Direct Payments, as well as referrals from Social Care.

Did you know?

Cheshire West and Chester Council has a dedicated Carer Liaison Officer that works alongside all age Carers, policy and partnership team and health and social care staff to ensure that Carer issues are addressed as quickly as possible and that Carers are supported in their caring role by having access to the information, advice and support they need.

Cheshire West and Chester Council has an Appointee and Deputyship Team which provides a vast range of services and support for those who have appointed someone look after their money. Their services include a housing benefit and council tax reduction scheme, financial assessments for care charges, welfare benefit advisors. The Council can act as the appointee where a person is no longer able to make decisions about their own finances and there is no other suitable person to do this on their behalf. They liaise with the DWP, manage bank accounts, pay utility bills, invoices and arrange for the repayment of any debts they may have and talk with care and support agencies about service user access to additional funds for day to day items outside of their agreed care budget. Local council elections: 2 May 2019

You need to be registered in order to vote. Most people are, but if you have recently moved to a new address, it's important you check.

You can register anytime online at **gov.uk/register-to-vote**. It takes five minutes and all you need is your NI number. Once you're registered, you'll also be ready for general elections or referendums.

If you're unsure if you are registered, give us a call on **0300 123 7045** or email **elreg@cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk** and we can check.

Postal voting is easy

Postal voting is a convenient way to vote – especially if you find it difficult to make it to your polling station on election day – and it is easy to apply. Anyone can request a postal vote and you don't need to provide a reason.

You can request a postal vote when you register at the Government's website, or, if you are already registered, call or email us (as above) and we will send you an application form.
