Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984
(Tributes on the Hill Festival)
(Temporary Traffic Regulation) Order 2026

Notice is hereby given in accordance with the provisions of Section 14 (1) (b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to introduce a temporary 20mph and 40mph speed restriction in the Parishes of Alvanley and Frodsham while the Tributes on the Hill Festival takes place by the organiser.

The Order will come into force from 06:00 on Friday 3rd July 2026 until 06:00 on Monday 6th July 2026 and will restrict the speed limit on the following roads as detailed below.

20mph speed limit

- Manley Road, from its junction Hazlehurst Road and its junction with Riley Bank Road.

40mph speed limit

- Manley Road, from its junction with Commonside and New Pale Road to its junction with Riley Bank Road.

Pedestrian access to premises situated on or adjacent to the roads will be maintained at all times.

Nothing in the Order shall prevent driving upon the said lengths of road of any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any premises situate on or adjacent to the lengths of road or in connection with agriculture, building construction, works of repair and the like or use in an emergency of vehicles for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

The promoter of the event is Tributes on the Hill Festival.
