

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 section 119

The Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council (Public Footpath No 4 (Part) and Public Footpath No 5 (part) Beeston) Public Path Diversion Order 2018

The above Order, made on the 12 April 2018 under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will divert That length of Public Footpath 4 in the parish of Beeston commencing at OS grid reference SJ 5337 5983 (point A on Plan SD/051A) then running in a generally north easterly direction for approximately 138 metres to the termination point on Bates Mill Lane at OS grid reference SJ 5348 5991 to a new line Beeston commencing at a point on the field boundary at OS grid reference SJ 5337 5983 (point A on Plan SD/051A) then running in a generally east north easterly direction for approximately 126 metres to join the existing footpath 5 on a field boundary at OS grid reference SJ 5349 5987 AND That length of Public Footpath 5 in the parish of Beeston commencing on a field boundary at OS grid reference SJ 5349 5987 (point C on Plan SD/051A) then running in a generally northerly direction for a distance of approximately 37 metres to OS grid reference SJ 5348 5991 to a new line commencing at a point on the field boundary at OS grid reference SJ 5349 5987 (point C on Plan SD/051A) running in a generally north north easterly direction for a distance of approximately 25 metres to Bates Mill Lane at OSGR SJ 5350 5990

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council may confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation, any representations and objections that have not been withdrawn will be sent with the Order.
