# ANNUAL INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING STATEMENT (COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY (CIL) AND SECTION 106)

FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2020/21

December 2021

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#### Introduction

This report provides information on the monetary (and non-monetary) contributions sought and received from developers for the provision of infrastructure to support development in Cheshire West and Chester, and the subsequent use of those contributions.

This report covers the financial year 1 April 2020 – 31 March 2021 and reports all the funds due and actually received in that time. Payments received after 31 March 2021 will be reported in next year's Infrastructure Funding Statement.

Cheshire West and Chester seeks developer contributions through the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) and Section 106 agreements (also known as "planning obligations").

CIL was introduced in 2010 and has been charged in Cheshire West and Chester since 1 September 2017. CIL is a set charge, based on the gross internal area floorspace of buildings, on residential and retail developments in certain areas of the borough. The money is used help fund the infrastructure needed to address the cumulative impact of development across our area. Local planning authorities must use CIL to fund 'the provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure to support the development of the area'. There is also a neighbourhood portion of CIL – 'Local CIL' – which is similarly able to fund infrastructure but can also fund 'anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development places on an area'. Under 'Local CIL', a CIL charging authority must pass 15% of local CIL receipts to the parish council for the area where a CIL liable development takes place, rising to 25% if the parish has a Neighbourhood Plan in place. In unparished areas, the CIL charging authority can spend equivalent amounts in the locality, following engagement with local communities.

Section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 enables a local planning authority to enter into a negotiated agreement – a planning obligation - to mitigate the impact of a specific development, to make it acceptable in planning terms. The planning obligation might, for example, require the provision or contribution to a new or improved road, school, health facility or local green infrastructure. Local planning authorities can also seek planning obligations to secure a proportion of affordable housing from residential developments. In some instances, section 106 planning obligations may require payments to be made to parish councils or the local Clinical Commissioning Group who work with GP surgeries.
