# WEST CHESHIRE TOGETHER LOCAL STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP

## Implementation status of Local Area Agreement delivery plans

### PURPOSE

- 1.1 The West Cheshire Together Local Strategic Partnership approved a Local Area Agreement (LAA) performance management framework at its meeting on the 30 April 2009. The framework is composed of nine steps:
- Steps 1 to 5 focus on the **planning** element of the framework – the production and approval of delivery plans for all designated and non-designated LAA indicators.
  - Step 6 to focuses on the **doing** element of the framework – the implementation of delivery plans.
  - Steps 7 to 9 focus on the **reviewing** element of the framework – examining the extent to which delivery plans have been implemented, whether any delivery issues have arisen to date, and if so, how those issues should be resolved.
- 1.2 This report **reviews** the current implementation status of designated and non-designated indicator LAA delivery plans and indicates how that status translates into likely performance reward grant award.

### DELIVERY PLAN IMPLEMENTATION STATUS

- 2.1 The tables below and on the next page summarise the delivery status of designated and non-designated delivery plans as at 31 August 2009. Each delivery plan has been allocated a Red/Amber/Green (RAG) status by the delivery plan owner. In total there are 34 designated and 19 non-designated indicators that are included within the LAA. The implementation status of the 10 statutory educational attainment indicators is also shown. Appendix A contains more detailed information on the implementation of those delivery plans falling under each thematic group.

## EXCEPTION REPORTS

- 3.1 Exception reports are required for any delivery plans assessed as **Red** and/or where in-year indicator performance is 10% or more below the LAA target set. In some cases, partners set in-year targets to take account of seasonal variations. In those cases, in-year performance is assessed against the in-year target.
- 3.2 Based on the in-year implementation status of delivery plans so far returned, **none** are assessed as Red.
- 3.3 The Safer and Stronger Communities Group has recommended the ceasing of activity against a non-designated LAA indicator - Priority 37 Alcohol arrest referrals. This particular indicator was originally included in the agreement to gain a better understanding of local progress with the Home Office pilot project, which referred individuals for alcohol related arrests to a treatment service provided through the Cheshire Drug and Alcohol Action Team (DAAT). The Home Office has not provided continued funding for this project into 2009/10. In the absence of any other funding, the Safer and Stronger Communities Group decided at its meeting on the 11 September 2009 to cease activity against this LAA Priority indicator. The West Cheshire Together Local Strategic Partnership is asked to endorse that decision.
- 3.4 For those indicators where an in-year delivery plan implementation report was outstanding at the end of September 2009, there are a number that may potentially become Red during 2009/10. They are as follows, together with the reasons for that assessment.
- a) LAA Priority 10 – NI 56 obesity in primary school age children in Year 6
  - b) LAA Priority 13 – NI 112 under 18 conception rate
  - c) LAA Priority 15 – NI 117 16 to 18 year olds who are not in education, employment and training (NEET).
  - d) LAA priority 24 – NI 153 working age people claiming out-of-work benefits in the worst performing neighbourhoods
- 3.5 LAA Priority 10 – NI 56 obesity in primary school age children in Year 6
- In a report submitted to the NHS Western Cheshire Primary Care Trust Board on the 30 September 2009, the reduction in Childhood Obesity Rate was assessed as a predicted fail for 2008/09, however the final result was 'under achieved' at publication on the 15<sup>th</sup> October 2009.
- 3.6 LAA Priority 13 – NI 112 under 18 conception rate
- In a report submitted to the NHS Western Cheshire Primary Care Trust Board on the 30 September 2009, the reduction in teenage pregnancy rate was assessed as a predicted fail for 2008/09, which was expected. Robust action plans have been submitted to the local authority, who leads on the response to the National Support Team for Teenage Pregnancy visit in May 2009.

3.7 LAA Priority 15 – NI 117 16 to 18 year olds who are not in education, employment and training (NEET).

Although a mid-year delivery plan implementation status return for this indicator is still outstanding, Connexions Cheshire and Warrington has reported a performance for this indicator at 31 July 2009 of 6.3% compared to the LAA 2009/10 target of 4.0%. Connexions has implemented a NEET Strategy 2009-2011 and NEET Improvement Plan. There is already a broad range of targeted activities that are well established such as additional Personal Adviser time in NEET schools and specific work with teenage mothers. This strategy highlights the key issues Connexions and other partners need to address to further reduce NEET, particularly during the current economic downturn.

3.8 LAA priority 24 – NI 153 working age people claiming out-of-work benefits in the worst performing neighbourhoods

The latest result for this indicator shows a deteriorating trend in performance, from 29.4% in May 2008 to 30.1% in February 2009. The 2009/10 target for this indicator is 29.34%. The data for this indicator is published six months in arrears with the May 2009 result due in November 2009. Given the extent of the economic downturn, exemplified by a 68% increase in the number of people claiming job seekers allowance in the last 12 months within the Cheshire West and Chester area, it is likely that this indicator will deteriorate further during 2009/10.

## PERFORMANCE REWARD GRANT

4.1 Based on the projected outturn set out in Appendix B (see page 22), an average performance of **80.7%** will be achieved. This equates to a performance reward grant of **£1,466,800** (see paragraphs 10 -13 of the LAA performance report submitted to the West Cheshire Together Local Strategic Partnership in July 2009).

## RECOMMENDATIONS

5.1 The West Cheshire Together Local Strategic Partnership is asked to:

- Note and comment on the current implementation status of LAA delivery plans and projected performance reward grant.
- Endorse the decision by the Safer and Stronger Communities Group to remove LAA priority 37 alcohol arrest referrals as a local indicator from the LAA.

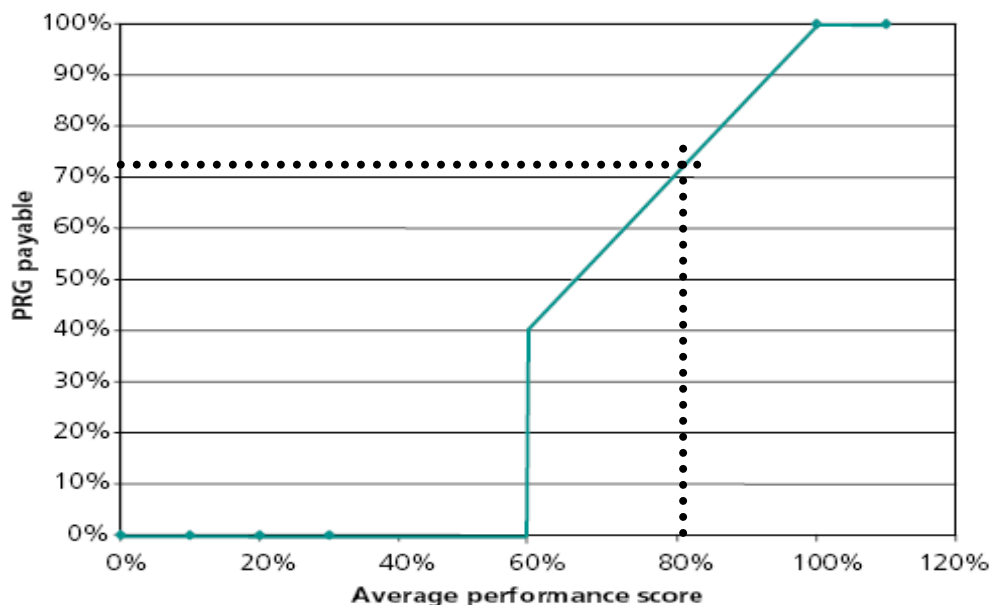
