## **Slide 2 - Resident Led Commissions**

- Recognised approach that LBH&F have been taking since 2015
- The Disabled People's Commission was one of nine that have been completed
- eight Commissions are currently ongoing

## **Slide 3 - Co-Production**

- Not talking at the end of a process
- Not asking if people agree with a decision
- “Where disabled residents and decision makers are working together in an active way to plan, design and review policies and services that affect our lives and get rid of the barriers they face.”

## **Slide 4 - Disabled Peoples Commission**

- Ten disabled people on the Commission plus Tara Flood as chair
- Complete autonomy over focus, recommendations and speaker invitations
- Properly resourced
- 18 months to conduct
- 8 recommendations
- Fully accessible report – ‘Nothing about disabled people without disabled people’

## **Slide 5 - Recommendations**

- Take a human rights approach
- Commit to co-production

- Develop a communication strategy for co-production
- Strengthen Disabled people's organisations
- Make services deliver what disabled residents want
- Develop a budget
- Review support and funding for Disabled Peoples Organisations
- Do independent monitoring

## **Slide 6 - Implementation**

- Focus on strategic recommendations and systemic culture change
- Senior strategic leads for coproduction appointed
- Coproduction Implementation Group turning the recommendations into an action plan
- Good quality disability training – all Cllrs, All senior management teams, 250 front line staff
